



Speaking...

A few weeks ago, during a homily, I extolled the virtues that St. James wrote about in his Epistle, of being “quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to anger” (1:19) and there is great wisdom in that advice. Most spiritually minded people will tell you that the faithful life is one with far more listening and much less speaking. But that is not to say that there isn’t a time for words, and a time to speak what must be spoken. Our baptismal vows and Holy Scripture commend speaking too, and there is a time when silence is surely unacceptable.

Perhaps there have been times in your life when you’ve encountered those moments. When you knew to speak would be costly, but you knew also that you had to speak, “for the LOVE of God!” The prophet Jeremiah talks about this experience like a fire in his bones (20:9). He wants to cover his mouth, to keep his head down and just be silent. But he grows weary from holding it in. He knew very well his words would be costly (they were!) but he also knew to fail to speak the words of God would be even worse.

I was surprised recently, during Morning Prayer, when I found both the Hebrew Bible (also called “Old Testament”) lesson and the Greek Bible (“New Testament”) lesson both addressed this very human challenge of knowing that there are times when we must speak out, even when the cost is potentially great. I say I was surprised because the probability of a coincidence like that is not great. The lessons assigned for Morning Prayer are not really keyed thematically to each other.

If you pray the Morning and Evening offices daily, over the course of two years, you basically read through the majority of the Old Testament once, and the New Testament three times. As a seminary professor of mine pointed out, this isn’t because the Greek Bible is three times as important, but that because the Hebrew Bible is about three times as long. But, I digress, the point is that it would be surprising to find two lessons with such close themes coinciding as they did. Yet, I’ve come to expect such serendipity from God!

In the first instance, we had the wonderful story of Queen Esther. She had been found beautiful by the Persian king, who had made her his queen, not realizing she is Jewish. However, that king had also given authority to one of his evil underlings, Haman, who sought both the plunder and destruction and of all the Jews living in that kingdom. Mordechai, Esther’s cousin who had raised her from infancy, sends her a message, saying that she must go in and speak with the king. But, Esther responds to her cousin that the penalty for coming before the king, without his having sent for you, is death!

Mordechai sends another message to Esther, and here is the kicker, he says, “Do not think that in the king’s palace you will escape any more than all the other Jews. For *if you keep silence at such a time as this*, relief and deliverance will rise for the Jews from another quarter, but you and your father’s family will perish. Who knows? Perhaps you have come to royal dignity for just such a time as this.” (4:13-14, *emphasis mine*). Now there is a thought! Not only is she to take the risk, and not keep silent, but it could be that God put her in this position (of access to royal power) for the very purpose of speaking up.

Most of the time, in such circumstances, we think only of the cost to ourselves. “What will my speaking out cost me, my family, my future career prospects?” I wonder if we ever ponder the possibility that “perhaps God has put ME right here, right now, in this moment, so that I would dare to speak!” I think of whistleblowers, or those of the present #MeToo movement who dare to challenge our culture of silence (especially as it relates to sexual violence), knowing full well that they may be further victimized or ridiculed. I give thanks for their courage. I’m also grateful for those who have dared to speak up in the Roman Catholic Church (and any and every Church) about their abuse by clergy, having finally broken a silence that has persisted for too long.

What amazing courage it takes to speak up. How costly it can be to proclaim the truth. Yet, it is “truth” that our Lord tells us will free us (Jn 8:32). It will free victims who have suffered too long in silence. They’ve already come to see that they are far from being alone. And we have all come to realize that the sin of this abuse and violence is far more widespread and pervasive than we ever could have imagined. This truth is good for the Church of God and it is good for our culture. May it be that we have the courage to say, “this stops now, with our generation!”

Back to that day when I was reading Morning Prayer. In the second lesson that morning, we read of St. Paul, as he leaves Athens and heads to Corinth for the first time. Paul is one who certainly faced great opposition for his message and endured much suffering for the proclamation of the truth about Jesus Christ. He is ridiculed. He is stoned. He is beaten and imprisoned. People scoff at him and make false claims about him. Yet, Paul perseveres, thanks be to God. In Corinth, the believers risk much, and some pay a heavy price for their Christian commitment. Yet, Paul has a vision one night, in which Jesus says to him “Do not be afraid, but speak and do not be silent; for *I am with you*” (Acts 18:9-10, *emphasis, again mine*.).

Blessedly, Christ also gives Paul some assures even beyond the fact that he is with Paul, as Jesus adds, “no one will lay a hand on you to harm you, for there are many in this city who are my people.” That is good news! Paul stays there for another eighteen months, preaching and teaching. He is not alone. Christ is with him. Others are with him too.

There are certainly times to keep silence. There are times to speak out. Determining which is which is the work of prayer and discernment. But our words and actions mustn’t ever be guided by fear, or mere self-preservation. They must be guided by those three great things that Paul writes to the Corinthians about, “faith, hope and love” (1 Cor 13:13) and I would add, “courage.” Yes, courage, for just as Christ was with Paul, he is with us!

- Digital Assets -

What happens to your online accounts when you die?

So much of our life is spent online. We access our bank accounts, send emails, connect with friends, store family photos, and spend hours on social media. Have you considered what happens to these online accounts when you're gone? Who will have access to your email? Will your family be able to post on your Facebook page? Will your heirs be able to find the money you've worked hard to accumulate? Our increasing dependence on computers causes questions about digital assets to constantly expand.

Assembly Bill 691 became law effective January 1, 2017. The Uniform Fiduciary Access to Digital Assets Act allows you to designate who will have access to your accounts. For example, you can name a legacy contact on your Facebook page by going to Settings, Manage Account, Add a Legacy Contact. If you die without having named a legacy contact, the law allows you to name an agent in your will or trust. You can also name an agent in your power of attorney. This person would have access to your digital assets if you are still living but mentally incapacitated. If you fail to plan in naming a legacy contact and in creating an estate plan, then the terms of service for Facebook will determine whether your fiduciary will gain access to your account.

What is a digital asset? It is an electronic record in which a person has a right or interest. Digital assets include domain names, web pages, blogs, online storage accounts, photo sharing accounts, online stores, online auction sites, listservs, tax preparation accounts, YouTube, iTunes, and video gaming accounts. Digital assets also include social media accounts such as Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, and Snapchat. Intellectual property such as copyrights, patents, and trademarks are also considered digital assets.

The type of devices your designated agent will have access that goes beyond your computer. Their access includes your smartphone, digital camera, Kindle, tablet, and other storage devices, such as flash drives. Information stored in the Cloud is also included. As technology develops, similar hardware and devices will be included.

The value of digital information may appear small, however it may lead a user to gain access to other assets with significant value, such as passwords for online investment accounts or advertising revenue from web pages or blogs. Most would agree that while our collection of online photos is of little monetary value, it has sentimental value beyond measure.

Plan ahead to protect your digital assets by establishing an estate plan. Executing a will or trust allows you to include specific provisions for digital assets. If your will or trust was drafted prior to 2017 it likely does not include this designation because this law is new. See your estate attorney to create a will or trust for you and your family. Or if you already have a plan, ask your attorney for an amendment that reflects your wishes for your digital assets.



- Digital Assets Continued -

Nominating an agent for your digital assets will allow them to use, access, modify, control, transfer, archive and delete electronic information and accounts. This is essential to protecting you. If you have a trust, the agent you nominate is often the same person as your trustee. For example, you will want your agent to gain access to your online bank accounts so they can properly administer your estate. You will want them to be able to relocate the funds to a trust account and distribute any remaining monies to beneficiaries after payment of your outstanding bills and taxes. Finally, you will want your agent to have the authority to close your online bank accounts once administration is complete. Identity theft among the living is a problem. Identity theft among the deceased is even more common. Avoid the possibility of your online funds being a target for thieves by nominating an agent to act quickly after your passing.

Get organized by creating an inventory of your online accounts and devices. Make a list of the user names and passwords for each account. Update it on a monthly basis to keep it current. Provide the list to your designated agent or let them know where it can be found. You can also subscribe to a password manager program. Finally, contact your attorney to be certain you have nominated a person you trust to manage your digital assets on your incapacity or death. For more information, visit SanClementeEstateLaw.com.


