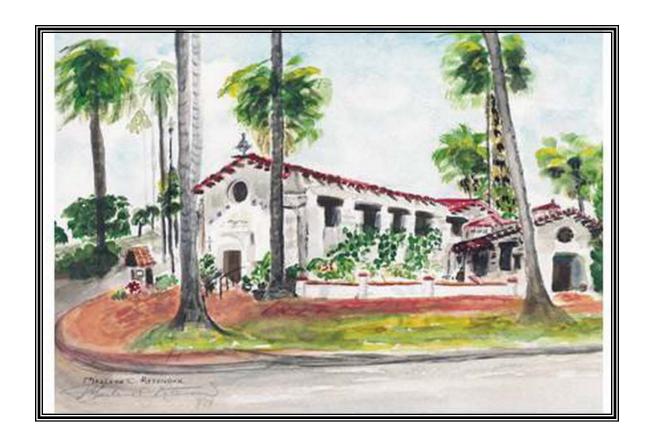

78th Annual Meeting - January 28, 2008

Opening Prayer & Call to Order

The Rev. Cn. Diane Jardine Bruce opened the 78th Annual Meeting with a prayer and called the meeting to order.

A MOTION was made by Tina Inglish, seconded and CARRIED that the minutes of the 2007 Annual Meeting be approved as submitted.

Hearing no nominations from the floor, a MOTION was made by Pat Welliver, seconded and CARRIED that the nominees as presented be declared elected by acclamation.

Alternate Delegates to Diocesan Convention (2008):

The names of *Frank Soto* and *Melissa James* were submitted for convention alternate. Hearing no further nominations from the floor, a MOTION was made by Pat Welliver, seconded and CARRIED that the nominations be closed and the nominees as presented be declared elected by acclamation.

Deanery Ten Representative:

The name **Derek Wilson** was submitted for nomination as Deanery Representative. Hearing no other nominations from the floor, a MOTION was made by Pat Welliver, seconded and CARRIED that the nominations be closed and Derek Wilson be declared elected by acclamation.

New Treasurer:

Joe Silva announced his retirement as Treasurer after $11\frac{1}{2}$ years of service. Diane announced that **Russ** Inglish has accepted the position as Treasurer.

Diane presented gifts to: Russ Inglish (Sr. Warden), Mark Banion (Jr. Warden/Outreach), Joe Silva (Treasurer), Steve James (Finance), Venice Peek (Evangelism/Congregational Development) and Sylvia Sepulveda (Youth)) for their years of service to St.Clement's.

Appointment to fulfill the Remainder of a Term of office:

Diane announced that she has appointed **Duke Welliver** to fill the remainder of the term of office of Mark Banion (one year).

Rector's Report

Some of the accomplishments in 2007 include the following:

- Our pledge base is was up as we have welcomed new members.
- Our Sunday School & Youth Group are growing.
- We have welcomed the Rev. Daniel Morrow as the new Associate Rector and Chandra Boughton as Parish Administrator and they have been a wonderful help to Diane. The challenge faced in the next 18 months is raising the pledge base enough to keep Dan at St. Clement's. The Bishop is currently paying 100% of Dan's expenses but we will have to start footing the bill in July of 2009.
- A new energy has developed in the parish regarding projects thanks to the introduction of a "project chart" by Venice Peek. This allows for a new way to handle big events. Instead of one person being in charge and "working themselves ragged", we have groups of people coming together to plan and put together the event. If you haven't been asked to help yet, please volunteer.

Treasurer's Report

Treasurer, Joe Silva presented the following report of the church's finances for the year ending 12-31-07:

Net difference (Annual Income minus Actual Expenses): 7,443.78

We did receive a grant from the Diocese for \$33,475.00 to cover the expense of Dan Morrow, we did not have in the budget for 2007. We spent a comparable amount on Dan's salary and benefits. This caused the actual expense and income numbers to be inflated. However, the net result was \$7,443.78 to the good.

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The key components which account for the net increase over expenses were \$ 6,920.97 in Current Pledges and \$2,084.42 in Plate Offerings.

Balance in the Diocesan Trust Account as of 12-31-07 was \$63,112.50.

The amount in the pure Endowment Fund account as of 12-31-07 was \$10,000.00

Actual pledges to date total **142** with a total value of **\$320,000** compared to **\$310,000** at this time last year. We also have **22** families who have envelopes but historically not pledged. Their annual giving runs around **\$13,000**. We have received **\$17,375** in prepaid pledges. After factoring in a 4% fallout rate for the balance of pledges expected, the net should be **\$303,000** which is the budgeted pledge number for 2008.

A MOTION was made by Pat Welliver seconded and CARRIED that the Treasurer's Report be accepted as presented.

2008 Budget

The 2008 Budget has been increased approximately to meet our Mission Share obligation. After reviewing the 2008 proposed budget,

New Business

A. Anchor Society: Russell Kerr addressed the meeting regarding the formation of a Pure Endowment Fund called the "Anchor Society." Russell stated that only the interest from the endowment fund may be spent. The principle may not be used. There is an Anchor Society Enrollment Form on the web page. Anyone who enrolls in the Anchor Society between January 28, 2008 and January 28, 2009 will be considered a "founding member" and their name will be placed in the Founder's Book (located in the glass case in the church library and will receive a "Founder's Coin." The Anchor Society brochure was designed by Megan Morrow. Brochures are available today and are also available from the church office. Bishop Bruno will host a luncheon for the founding members of the Anchor Society.

B. Tai Chi Class: Master Earl (Welliver) announced that he is forming a Tai Chi class,

8 sessions, once per week on Wednesday. Each class is \$5.00 and money will be directed to Diane's Discretionary Fund. A sign up sheet will be available. Classes will begin as soon as 10 people have signed up.

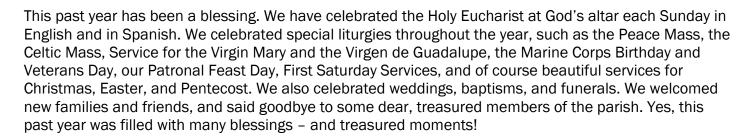
Reports

Rector's Report

Dear Friends in Christ,

For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. (Matthew 6:21)

The people of St. Clement's have indeed honored the treasures and gifts that God has given us this past year. Through your generosity and the efforts of our hardworking staff, we ended the year 2008 with a net income of \$2,664.00, while meeting all of our bills and commitments.



One of the sad moments for St. Clement's this past year was the retirement of Betty Comer. Betty has faithfully served in the office as our Volunteer Secretary for over 20 years. Her failing health forced her to retire, and as she always threatened, she went "kicking and screaming" — Betty loves St. Clement's! Betty is now living with her son David and daughter-in-law Clea in Mexico. She will be back on occasion for visits, however. During the first quarter of 2009 we will have a formal "retirement party" for Betty, and I pray we will all gather to thank this wonderful, dedicated woman for her years of hard work.

Under the direction of the Rev. Dan Morrow, the Youth Group was formed and grew. Momentum was not lost with this group when Dan left us in September, as the mentors (Wendy and Martin Berube, Lauri McIntosh, Melissa James and Steve Bruce) have kept the group going and growing! The Sunday School, under the direction of Tracy Sherman VanNostrand continues to grow as well. We are blessed to have these young people and their families with us at St. Clement's!

It is humbling to me to do God's work in this place with all of you.

As we start this New Year we have challenges ahead of us. The first challenge, as you know, has to do with our budget for 2009. We have had to launch a "bridge the gap" campaign to help us make up for lost pledges due to death or people moving out of the area. We are still approximately \$15,000.00 short of what we need to keep the church doors open and ministry going for St. Clement's. We've tightened our belts, and are trying to make ends meet for the year 2009. No one on the staff is receiving a raise or Cost of Living increase in 2009, and we are NOT planning for any reduction in staff or programming. Please note that our current budget, tight as it is, does NOT include any monies towards hiring a second priest for the staff – not even part-time – it is not possible this year.

Another challenge for the congregation – an opportunity, actually – is my sabbatical time away in 2009 and 2010. According to my contract with the parish, I receive sabbatical time to rest, reflect, pray and to do work that is of benefit to the parish. Over one half of my time is dedicated to work – these weeks are used to study for my DMin in Congregational Development. In addition to my normal vacation time and continuing education time away, I will be gone an extra seven weeks this year on Sabbatical:

- Two weeks on pilgrimage to the Holy Land the end of January/beginning of February where I will be one of over 20 clergy learning to lead a pilgrimage there. I'm planning on leading a pilgrimage next year with members of this parish and others interested in going.
- Two weeks in May finishing up the Celtic study tour I started two years ago in Ireland. This year, it will be to England and Scotland, where I will add Anglican and Reformation History into my studies.
- One week in June studying at Evanston for my DMin (I add this week to the two weeks of
 continuing education that I use for the first portion of study at Evanston). Just to remind you, the
 DMin through Seabury Western requires three years of coursework. Students must meet three
 weeks each year on site in Evanston as well as complete independent study and the writing of
 papers before and after each on site program at home. The good news is, this is my last year of
 coursework.
- 2 weeks this fall writing my dissertation. This professional doctorate is geared toward benefiting
 the congregation. The working title of my dissertation is: U2 and Pirates and Prayers, oh my! The
 use of alternative liturgies and their effect on Church Growth. Again, the good news is, this is my
 last year of coursework. Once I write the dissertation, I'm on the fast track to receiving my degree
 next May.

The work of my sabbatical is a treasure to me – and one that I look forward to sharing with all of you. It may seem as though I'm gone a lot. Well, I will be, but I will be available by cell phone and email except for the four weeks I will be out of the country. Next year I will be away about the same amount of time. This is in lieu of taking the full fourteen weeks at once, on top of my vacation and continuing education time. In consultation with the vestry and wardens, we felt this would be the best way to handle my sabbatical time (normally, sabbatical time is taken all at once). I am working with the Diocese to find a priest that will be suitable as a substitute during my time away – one that is a good preacher, pastoral and of course, has a good sense of humor. Please know that this sacred sabbatical time is one that will benefit both you and me.

The last challenge we face during this coming year with my time away and the budget gap is the maintenance of the mission and ministries of this parish. That's where you all come full focus into the picture. The wardens and vestry will be working hard to maintain all the great things that we have going here – but they will need your help. Please, if you can volunteer to help with an event, host a coffee hour, be part of the liturgy teams on Sunday, let MaryAnn Morrison know, or call me at the Church Office. This is your opportunity to share the treasure – the abundance – that God has given you, and to spread the love in this parish!

Friends in Christ, Jesus understood that where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. We have much to treasure here at St. Clement's – the buildings, the people, coming together as a community of faith and doing ministry in this neighborhood. We have much to treasure in our personal lives as well – and we need to be thankful for all that we have, for all that we have is a gift from God. I give thanks for all of you, and our time here as pilgrims on a journey of faith in San Clemente!

Senior Warden

It has been quite a year at St. Clement's. In January we celebrated the ordination of Dan Morrow and the growing success of the youth group.

In February the Vestry started brainstorming on ways to attract new members. The Peaceful Warrior Academy had 83 students under Master Earl Welliver's tutelage.

March found the roof leaks repaired and new toilets installed in the women's restroom, both jobs done at no cost to the parish. The Maundy Thursday lamb supper was well attended and the Easter services were beautiful.

The Vestry voted in April to approve the hiring of a professional janitorial service to clean the offices, restrooms and kitchen.

Just in time for summer, fans were installed in the parish hall in May. In addition, new, lighter-weight round tables were purchased, as well as rectangular ones. The "junk room" downstairs was cleaned out and turned into a youth lounge and that freed up a room for teaching.

In June an information bulletin board was put up in the parish hall over the sign-up table. The "Get Acquainted" booklets in the church pews proved to be much appreciated by visitors.

August brought the San Clemente Street Fair and St. Clement's ice cream booth which was very successful. Good news came from the Peaceful Warrior program: three of 14 students attending the Tae Kwon Do World Championships won 1st place honors!

A "Noche Mexicano" party was held in September and it was well attended and provided much fun and fellowship. The congregation bid farewell to Dan Morrow who left to answer a call to serve in Switzerland.

Because of sparse attendance, the Wednesday 11:00 service was discontinued in October.

The Silent Auction in November was very well attended and the proceeds were high. That was good news to those on the finance committee.

There have been ups and downs this past year but, happily, more ups than downs. Youth group mentors stepped in to keep the youth group growing, the church grounds are in good condition, especially with the new tiles covering the area in front of the church. Diane is finishing up her studies at Seabury this coming summer. The office is running smoothly under the Parish Administrator, Chandra Boughton. There is something special about St. Clement's and it has been my privilege to have been the Sr. Warden this past year.

Junior Warden and Liturgy & Music

This year I was privileged to serve St. Clement's as Junior Warden in addition to my Vestry oversight of Liturgy and Music.

As Junior Warden, my primary responsibilities were assisting Senior Warden Anne Garcia when called on, and being the "people's warden" – *i.e.*, acting as a sounding board for parishioners' concerns, comments and questions. I am pleased to report that, based on my observations and experience over the past year, the parish is healthy and vibrant under the skillful, creative and heartfelt leadership of our rector, and its members were ever willing and able to meet the year's challenges. On a personal note, it was a pleasure to serve under Anne, whose wisdom and sound judgment were always paired with generosity and friendship.

In the areas of Liturgy and Music, the year was one of building on the innovations and strengths of the prior year. The rector continued her monthly Saturday evening worship services, with themes that ranged from old-time folk music from the movie "Oh Brother, Where Art Thou?" to a spirited Pirate Eucharist to a moving candlelight service for remembering the faithful departed. The rector also continued to celebrate special Sunday services, including a Peace Mass, a Celtic Mass, Marine Corps Birthday/Veterans Day, and Virgin of Guadalupe. All of these themed and special services, in addition to being popular, brought a great and varied wealth to the worship life of the parish. Attendance remained solid at our regular 8, 10 and 12 o'clock Sunday services, as shown in the table printed below.

The Wednesday morning Holy Eucharist and Healing Service was ended this year as a result of a decision to reallocate resources. Our highest gratitude goes to Father Packard Okie, who lovingly presided over those services for many years, and in doing so, brought Christian joy and comfort to countless people.

St. Clement's music program enriched our worship life under the continued and capable leadership of Dan Resch. The talent and dedication of our choirs and musicians were on display each Sunday and at many of the themed Saturday services. And at special services, Dan led both our regular and guest musicians in programs that made memorable each season of the Church year.

Let me send a wholehearted thanks to everyone who made our worship and liturgy—our "work of the people"—so Christ-centered and Spirit-filled in 2008. May God's blessing go to each person who gave so generously of time and talent.

Buildings and Grounds

There has not been a lot of activity around the parish this past year for Buildings and Grounds. A number of significant projects were completed in prior years such that no major projects needed to be undertaken in 2008. The following minor projects were completed in 2008:



- The roof leak in the women's bathroom caused significant damage to the ceiling and wall. The roof, wall and ceiling were repaired early in the year.
- Ceiling fans were purchased and installed in the Parish Hall.
- One workday was scheduled for general cleaning and greening. This is less than prior years because the various cleaning services we now use are keeping things in pretty good shape.

We plan to replace the concrete and tiles at the entryway to the sanctuary. This will be completed in early 2009. Any extra donations for this \$8,000 project would be greatly appreciated.

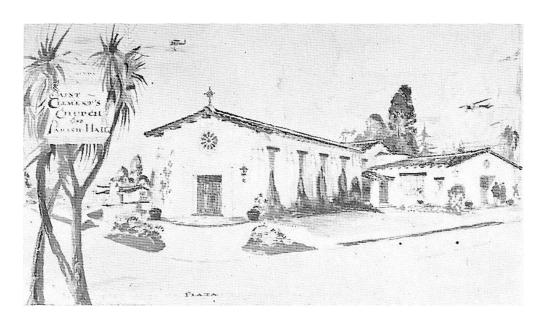

Finance/Treasurers Report

The following is a report of the status of the church finances for the year ending 12/31/08:

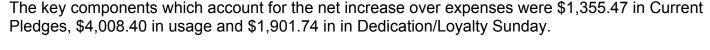

Net difference (Actual Income minus Actual Expenses): \$4,664.36



* We did receive a grant from the Diocese for 81,048.00 to cover the expense of Dan Morrow. As Dan left in mid-September, the Diocese stopped sending those funds. We spent a comparable amount to what was received on Dan's salary and benefits. This caused the actual expense and income numbers to be under. In actuality, we ended the year under in income by only \$657.00. The net result was \$4,664.36 to the good.

The Diocesan Investment Trust account as of 12/31/08 was \$42,163.76.

The amount in the Pure Endowment fund account as of 12/31/08 was \$12,140.48 in a CD, and \$25,000 waiting to be put into a special Money Market Fund through the DIT.

The actual pledges received to date total 112 with a total value of \$285,000 verses \$320,000.00 at this time last year. We also have 22 families who have envelopes but have historically not pledged. Their annual giving runs around \$14,000. We have received \$8,300 in prepaid pledges. After factoring in a 4% fallout rate for the balance of the pledges expected, the net should be \$280,032, which is the budgeted pledge number for 2009.

Our pledges are down this year due to members of the parish moving away from the area or who have died. These families were practicing the tithe, and their contributions to this parish were invaluable. While we are blessed to be welcoming so many new families with us, their giving level is not at the same level. Therefore, we are experiencing a budget gap that we have budgeted at 31,000. We have received approximately half that amount, and will be working to try to continue to bridge that gap during the year. If we cannot, programs and/or staff will have to be cut from the budget.

This year will be a challenging one for the parish, the county, the state, the nation and the world. We need your help in making sure we can meet the needs of those who come to us, and to ensure we can provide the same high-quality liturgies and programs that we currently offer.

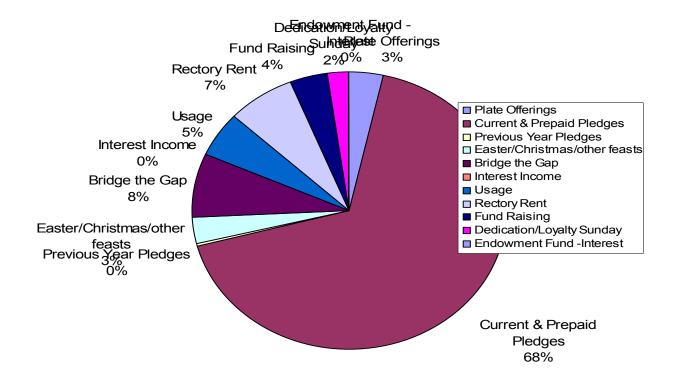

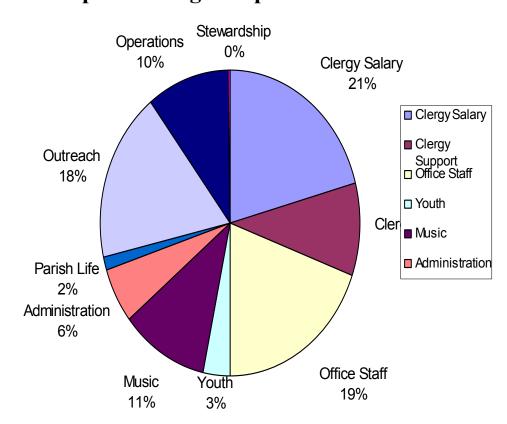

We use short readings on spirituality and Christianity as a catalyst for our conversations. During 2008 we read works by various authors, and focused a lot on the spirituality of men in the second half of their lives. This year we'll continue to explore the spiritual issues that men face during the first and second half of our lives. The readings are usually available at the information table a few weeks before our meetings, or by email. We'll also be praying about opportunities for service projects during 2009.

In the Spring, the Men of St. Clement's and Messiah Santa Ana will meet again for a Lenten retreat. Even though we have lost our beloved Mt. Calvary retreat house, we are still committed to holding an annual retreat for men. I invite you to consider a retreat this Spring. Come and get to know other men who are in various stages in their faith journey.

Outreach

Each year brings a new set of challenges, needs and opportunities for Outreach at St. Clement's and 2008 was no different. However, unlike the previous year, the majority of outreach efforts in 2008 were focused on needs closer to home in Orange County and in particular to people in need in San Clemente.

As always, our annual Outreach budget was supplemented by the generosity of St.

Clement's parishioners, who always have the willingness to help with causes that they see consistent with the mission of the church. Below is a representation of St. Clement's Outreach efforts in 2008

International

El Salvador – Through the donations of parishioners and other individuals and organizations, last year we were able to pay for a special surgery for a young boy in a remote village in El Salvador. This year we focused on his continued care.

Armenia -- We also sent a little money to Armenia for the work of an American dentist there. This dentist lives and works in Orange County, but go over and donates his time to fix dental problems in a country very much behind in that medical discipline.

National

The Youth Group, through a car wash, raised money to help relief efforts after Hurricane Ike.

State & County

AIDS Walk Orange County – Through donations provided by parishioners and support from the Outreach budget, walkers from St. Clement's generated more than \$1800 towards AIDS research.

Provided funds for the rebuilding of both Camp Stevens and Mount Calvary after the horrific fires in each of these places.

Provided much needed funding at a time of critical shortage for the Orange County Rescue Mission.

Donated to the Episcopal Urban Intern Program, which provides counseling and other services to people in need in the Long Beach area, while training young people to be counselors.

Local

Mary Erickson Community Housing – In addition to more than 40 St. Clement's parishioners who purchased tickets to attend the annual Salt Creek event, Outreach provided additional support for the development of low income housing in South Orange County.

Family Assistance Ministries (FAM) – Ongoing donation of food provided by parishioners supported the annual FAM Hunger walk.

The generosity of individual members of St. Clement's has allowed the Outreach budget to be used broadly as demonstrated by the examples above. Thank you to those who make it possible for all of us to do more of God's work.

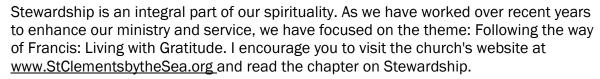

Stewardship

Stewardship is our response to all the gifts that God has given us. Your time, talent and treasure – they are your greatest gifts, given to you by a God who loves you unconditionally.





The financial foundation of St Clement's is our pledge. A very sincere thank you to all who pledged to support our ministries and who faithfully met their pledge throughout the year. Your pledge has enabled us to plan, to budget and to fund our church's ministries in a more effective and efficient manner.

The actual pledges received to date total 112 with a total value of \$285,000 versus \$320,000.00 at this time last year. We also have 22 families who have envelopes but have historically not pledged. Their annual giving runs around \$14,000. We have received \$8,300 in prepaid pledges. After factoring in a 4% fallout rate for the balance of the pledges expected, the net should be \$280,032, which is the budgeted pledge number for 2009.

Our pledges are down this year because of people that have either moved away from the area or died. These families were practicing the tithe, and their contributions to this parish were invaluable. While we are blessed to be welcoming so many new families with us, their giving level is not at the same level. Therefore, we are experiencing a budget gap that we have budgeted at 31,000. We have received approximately half that amount, and will be working to try to continue to bridge that gap during the year. If we cannot, programs and/or staff will have to be cut from the budget.

Our sincere appreciation to each one of you who signed a pledge card for 2009. If you have not, we urge you to consider doing so. You will see the report on our 2008 expenditures and our new 2009 budget in the Finance & Treasurer's Report.
